# INTERDISCIPLINARY LEARNING (IDL)

# Through our topics we will...

- -Through our study of past society, the Victorians, we will compare our lives with theirs. We will discuss why people and events from the Victorian era were important and the impact this has had on modern society.
- -In science we will explore the topic of space and gain an understanding of the size, scale, time and relative motion within the solar system.
- -We will explore forces- mainly looking at air resistance, friction, vibrations, waves and magnetic forces.

### NUMERACY

### In NUMERACY we will:

- Revise and consolidate place value to the 10 000s.
- Practise number sequences within place value.
- Continue to develop non-count-by-one strategies for addition and subtraction within 1000- we will focus on 2/3-digit whole numbers.
- Continue to develop and consolidate our knowledge of times tables- we are looking at 2, 4, 5, and 10 times tables this term.
- In multiplication we are working on counting visible collections- repeated addition and arrays and in division we are developing strategies for sharing and grouping.

### In MATHS we will:

- Develop our estimation skills within measure- we will estimate lenaths in mm, cm, m and km.
- We will measure length in mm cm, m and km.
- With Ms Cosgrove we will explore angles, symmetry and transformation.

# OTHER AREAS

In **RME** we will be investigating different world religions with a focus on buildings, symbols, clothing and religious books.

In **FRENCH** we will be revising and consolidating simple greetings, colours and numbers to 30.

In **MUSIC** we are going to focus on various music genres and styles through our programme ABC music.

### In **ART** we will:

- Investigate Roy Lichtenstein's pop art, particularly his pointillism pictures. We will create self-portraits using this new knowledge.
- We will investigate the colour wheel and how it can be applied in art.
